





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Over the course of the year our children were introduced to each of the Qualities at our Monday prayer assemblies held in the church. They have participated in a variety of school and class based activities chosen to enhance their understanding of each Quality. The Mercy Qualities incorporate Religious Education, SOSE and aspects of HPE. In particular, we have used the Mercy Qualities program to incorporate many of the concepts and activities of the newly released Brisbane Catholic Education program, 'Religious Life of the School.'

Mercy Qualities has at its core personal action. At St. Vincent's we strive to live our everyday lives according to the Mercy Qualities. Together, staff, children and parents endeavour to build and maintain a community which values these qualities in our every day lives and where we each strive to be more like Jesus. As a community which celebrates readily we so often witness Mercy Qualities in action.

Newsletters, level and prayer assemblies and liturgies have been used to spread the word on Mercy Qualities. By example, staff, parents and children are living and modelling Mercy Qualities in our school community. The ongoing care of our students, families and staff is an integral part of the culture of St Vincent's. My role is to provide "pastoral care, general personal advice, comfort and support to all students, families and staff." (NSCP)

In 2009, I have been employed two days a week as St Vincent's Community Care Coordinator. I am also a teacher and have enjoyed working at St Vincent's on and off for many years. As a mother of three young boys I understand the range of emotions that go hand in hand with the joys, trials and tribulations of raising young children!

My role is to listen and support without judgement. Sometimes it's helpful to come in and have an informal chat about concerns you may have. Alternatively you can talk to me over the phone or email me.

I have been employed to support students and the wider school community by providing an effective communication link between parents and the school. There is an established and successful referral process here at St Vincent's and I can help you determine who it is you need to contact in any given situation. I am also able to put you in touch with welfare and support agencies in the wider community.

During the year I have worked closely with our school counsellor and staff to provide support in cases of bereavement, illness, family breakdown or other crisis and loss situations." (NSCP.) This year I facilitated the 'Seasons for Growth' program which supports students in grief and loss circumstances such as divorce/ separation/ serious illness/ death of a loved one. I have loved this aspect of my role and will be offering this program again in 2010.

Earlier this year we established "Class Parent Representatives" who worked together to organise social gatherings each term. This has been extremely successful and I am very grateful for their support and input. It has been wonderful to see so many people involved in the social life of our fantastic school.

DATA PROJECTORS IN ROOMS

23 classrooms at St Vincent's have had a data projector package installed, providing teachers with a fantastic teaching and learning tool at their fingertips. These classrooms have had a ceiling mounted projector with speakers and cabling installed. This certainly brings learning and teaching into the 21st century at St Vincent's and will progressively change the way traditional lessons are delivered in the future.

KIDS CONNECT

On May 27 and 28, eight students from year six participated in 'Kids Connect' at the Gold Coast Convention Centre. The children were provided with a selection of topics to choose from and then worked in a small group with a teacher, on an individual topic.

30 NEW MACBOOKS

St Vincent's invested in 30 Mac-books in Term 1 to broaden the scope of multimedia work students are able to access. Applications such as i-movie, Garage band, i-DVD and photo booth have allowed students to create projects for integrated units of work and Digifest. Many students in the senior grades have been using the Macs to produce engaging and creative projects.

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ICT NETWORK UPGRADES

St Vincent's has made good use of government grants in 09. As part of an infrastructure upgrade grant St Vincent's has been able to upgrade all data and telephone cabling to an industry recognised standard. As a consequence St Vincent's will have a 'state of the art' network capable of meeting growing demands in a large school.

250 NEW NET-BOOKS FOR CLASSROOM USE

We were very pleased to receive our order of 250 Dell Latitude net-books at the start of Term 4. This has enabled all year levels to have access to an additional 30 computers for more hands on computing in the classroom. Thanks to the generosity of our P & F in supporting school priorities we were able to afford such a great resource. Each net-book proudly displays the plaque - 'Proudly provided by the St Vincent's School P & F Association 2009.







HEALTHY & ACTIVE @

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The activity never stopped this year!! We hit the ground 'running' with Runners' Club. Prep and Year 1 participated in Small Sports. Bluearth in Year 2 and Dance Cart in Year 3 – 7 had our students rocking and rolling on the oval. Everyone was 'in the swim' with lessons for Years 3-7 at the beginning of the year and Year 1-3 at the end of the year.

Cross country, track and field and interschool sport had people moving in Term 2 and 3. We had Oz Tag, hockey, AFL and more development programmes operating during the year.

In Term 4 students in Years 4, 5, 6 & 7 chose a number of different sports to try rather than Interschool sport – and it

proved to be a resounding success.

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












GOOD-BYE OLD LIBRARY

The St Vincent's Library was originally built in 1986. Bernadette O'Brien packed up the library from the original site at Surfers and was given the task of setting up what was then a library capable of accommodating a projected enrolment of 400 children. Twenty-three years later, the school has grown from a single stream to over half the school being four streams. Bernadette has once again helped with the momentous task of packing up the library.


